### Excerpts from the History of New Carlisle Sportsmen's Club

1960 The town of New Carlisle was founded in 1810, and it celebrated its sesquicentennial in 1960. In keeping with the spirit of that milestone, many residents grew beards and informally organized themselves as "Brothers of the Brush." Some of these "brothers" recognized that they shared interests in hunting, fishing, and woodland recreation, and they soon became serious about forming a "club." Early meetings were conducted in the basement of the old public library located on the north-west corner of Madison and Main Streets. Charles "Chuck" Stroud led these meetings and is still recognized as the "backbone" of this body. Surviving members recall that dues were "only ten to fifteen dollars."

**Mini Rattle Battle Team Matches** - Service rifle match, 4 shooters + 1 coach per team, 192 rounds divided among the 4 shooters, 50 second time limit, 6 targets at 100 yards.

**M-1 Carbine Matches (per CMP rules)** - 100 yards, 5 sighters/5 min, 10 shots slow fire prone/5 min, 10 shots rapid fire prone/60 sec, 10 shots rapid fire sitting/50 sec, 10 shots slow fire standing/10 min.

**Smallbore Prone Matches (per NRA rules)** - 100 yards, 1 match any sight, 1 match metallic sight, 40 shots per match,

**Springfield/Vintage Military Bolt Action Matches (per CMP rules)** - 100 yards, 5 sighters/5 min, 10 shots slow fire prone/10 min, 10 shots rapid fire prone/80 sec, 10 shots slow fire standing/10 min.

**M-1 Garand/M1A Match (per CMP rules)** - 100 yards, 5 sighters/5 min, 10 shots slow fire prone/10 min, 10 shots rapid fire prone/80 sec, 10 shots slow fire standing/10 min.

**Highpower Rifle Matches (per NRA rules)** - 100 yards, 10 shots slow fire standing/10 min, 10 shots rapid fire sitting/60 sec, 10 shots rapid fire prone/70 sec, 20 shots slow fire prone/20 min.
