More from *Notes on the History of New Carlisle Sportsmen's Club*:

- 1966 Harry Thompson, president
- The first structure was built on this land as a garage for the tractor and other tools. This was a concrete block building approximately 20' x 20'. The tractor was moved outside to make room for membership meetings. Bob Minton, an accomplished mason, is given credit for construction of this original building. Somewhat later, Bob also built a free-standing fireplace near the southwest corner of the building. This fireplace was used for warming the sportsmen in cold weather and for cookouts.
- 1966 Sep 28 A well was drilled to a depth of 143 feet. Static level of water was 65 feet. Quick sand was found between 65 and 140 feet. Gravel from 140 to 143 feet.
- 1967-68 Charles "Chuck" Stroud, president; his third term
- 1967 Jun 22 The Club took out a \$3,000 mortgage at 6.5% with New Carlisle Federal Savings and Loan Association. Charles L. Stroud, president and Thomas D. Cook, treasurer represented the Club.
- 1968 Feb 27 The IRS granted tax-exempt status to the Club. Annual filing of Form 990T was required.
- 1968 According to Clark County Auditor records, the original building was expanded to 3200 sq ft.
- 1968 Aug Trap house installation by Rhodeside, Inc. of Piqua, Ohio. Date established by company invoice.
- 1969 Ray Trulson, president. Number of members – 49.
- 1970-71 Jim Schildknecht, president; Bill L. Demmitt, VP; Arnold Riewerts, secretary; Carl J. Complement, treasurer; Harry Thompson, Sgt-at-arms
- 1970 Tax return filed by Carl J. Complement, treasurer. Total income of \$9,733.
