Also a reminder, if you plan to shoot at distances longer than 100 yards, you need to attend our long range shooting course. It is offered before every membership meeting and by appointment. Contact a board member for more details.

Finally, before using the south (100 yard+) range, be sure no one is at the 300 yard firing line. We have had people walk out in front of shooters. And before using the 300 yard line be sure to post the signs by the back door and outside near the picnic tables.

Highpower is 4 positions, 80 rounds + sighters. 22 RF Any Sight is 40 rounds, fired prone + unlimited sighters. 25 yard Pistol is .22 and center fire, slow fire, timed fire, and rapid fire, 10 rounds each. All Saturday matches begin at 9:00am, signup at 8:30. Sunday afternoon matches begin at 1:00pm with signup at 12:30.

More from *Notes on the History of New Carlisle Sportsmen's Club*:

1975 Constructed frame utility shed — 18' x 20'

Using the free-standing fireplace as part of its west wall, this structure was built as a warming room for wintertime meat shoots. These shoots, the major source of Club revenue at that time, were conducted from the porch area toward the south. Concrete walkways and metal target stanchions were built to formalize the meat shoot facility.

1975 Dan Mitch remembers that surplus triangular "cases" were obtained from the Air Force. He was part of the crew that refurbished these cases as displays for advertising the Club's mission at fairs and other public events.

1976 Jay Wolfe, president

1976 The Club sold "tags" that were required to be displayed by members while fishing. Don Barnhart recalls being fined \$5 for letting his 16 year old son, Brian, fish without a "license." For a "can't-miss" catfish bait recipe—mix bread dough, limburger cheese, and potato flakes.
